GCSE English Language

Course content and overview

The English language course is designed to teach pupils to apply a range of reading and writing skills. The exams will al be on unseen texts so the pupil's ability to apply their skills in a range of situations is essential.

There will also be two oracy units completed. The tasks will be taught in lessons but further preparation at home will be necessary, especially for the Individual presentation.

There is a limited amount of information to memorise for these exams so revision should focus on practice questions and past papers.

Exam Board: WJEC Assessment: 3 units

Unit 1:

- Task 1 (10%): Individual Researched Presentation topic linked to WJEC set themes June year 10.
- Task 2 (10%): Responding and Interacting group discussion topic selected by WJEC January/February year 11.

Unit 2: June, year 11

• Examination (40%): Reading and Writing: Description, Narration and Exposition. Section A (40 marks) will include a range of reading skills and Section B will test writing skills.

Section B

B1: about 10 minutes

B2: about 10 minutes planning about 40 minutes writing (1 task)

Unit 3: June, year 11

• Examination (40%) Reading and Writing: Argumentation, Persuasion and Instructional. Section A (40 marks) will include a range of reading skills and Section B will test writing skills.

about 50 minutes answering the questions

Section B:

about 10 minutes planning about 25 minutes writing for B1 about 25 minutes writing for B2
