Course content and overview

The WJEC GCSE Welsh Second Language specification enables learners to understand and use the language for a variety of purposes and audiences.

It develops learners' language learning skills and strategies in order to enable them to communicate and interact confidently and spontaneously in relevant situations and specified context.

Assessment Details

Assessment: 4 Units

UNIT 1:

- Pupils will complete this unit in Year 11.
- This unit is worth 25% of the whole qualification. (Unit Weighting: Speaking 10% / Listening 15%)
- Candidates will be expected to listen and watch a visual stimulus before discussing what they have watched with a partner or in a group of three.

UNIT 2:

- Pupils will complete this unit in Year 10.
- This unit is worth 25% of the whole qualification. (Unit Weighting: Speaking 20% / Listening 5%)
- .Candidates will be expected to respond orally and listen to peers through interaction with a partner or in a group of three.
- Candidates are expected to respond to stimuli provided by WJEC. The content of the materials will vary, e.g. graphs, pictures, stimuli, statistics, short reading texts etc.

UNIT 3:

- Pupils will complete this unit in Year 11.
- This unit is worth 25% of the whole qualification. (Unit Weighting: Reading 15% / Writing 10%.)
- The reading will be assessed through a range of structured questions.
- Candidates will be assessed on different formats of texts such as correspondence, instructions, tables and graphs, forms, marketing materials, and articles
- Candidates will be expected to respond to a range of questions.

UNIT 4:

- Pupils will complete this unit in Year 11.
- This unit is worth 25% of the whole qualification. (Unit Weighting: Reading 10% / Writing 15%.)
- Candidates will be assessed on different formats of texts such as letters, poems, diaries, graphs and advertisements
- Candidates will be expected to respond to a range of questions.
